William J. Adler, 92, Eagle, died Thursday, October 26, at his residence on Waukesha Road.

He was born May 4, 1897, in Milwaukee, to William and Pauline (Kuehni) Adler. A Navy veteran of World War I, he served on a ship carrying troops across the Atlantic. Prior to retiring from Unit Crane and Shovel Company, Milwaukee, he had worked locally in the Eagle area at the B & H Lumber Company, Eagle Springs Golf Resort, the railroad and helped construct silos.

He loved gardening and was a life-long member of St. Theresa's Catholic Church, Eagle, as well as being a member of the American Legion Sgt. Splecter-Schmidt Post 535.
